

Tutorial: Converting Audio Tapes to CD's

Description: Have you ever wanted to convert some old audio tapes (be they music, a speech or sermon) to a digital format (like CDs). This tutorial goes through the steps to do so.

Steps:

1. Insert the tape into the tape player
2. Connect one end of the cable into the headphones jack on the tape player
3. Connect the other end of the cable into the line-in connector on your computer (computers normally have 3 connectors – headphones, microphone, line-in. Some computers may only have 2, doubling the usage of a microphone connector with line-in).
4. Open the recording software. Ensure that you set the source to line-in and set the program to record a WAV file (used to burn to CDs).
5. Press record on the recording software and play on the tape player.
6. One the tape has played through press stop the recording.
7. Use your CD burning software to create an 'audio CD'. Add the file that you just recorded onto your computer and record to the CD.

Equipment Required:

- Cable, 3.5mm plug to 3.5mm plug (eg. [Cable](#))
- Tape player (walkman)
- Computer with CD Burner
- Sound recording software (eg. [ARFF](#))
- CD burning software (eg. [Nero](#))
